Drummoyne dominant

Drummoyne Dirty Reds have taken out the club championship and first and second grade grand finals.

Drummoyne first grade beat Woollahra Colleagues 34-24 to win the Kentwell Cup last weekend.

The game started well for Drummoyne, who led with a few tries from well-timed backline moves. Captain Carlos Jonker played strongly, cleaned up messy balls around the rucks and mauls and was merciless on the opposition.
