

# Dirty Reds clean up

DRUMMOYNE Rugby Club had a very successful day against Campbelltown on Saturday at Five Dock Park, winning all grades in the replay of round nine, which was washed out last month.

Drummoyne first grade regained the lead on the Kentwell Cup ladder by beating the previously undefeated Campbelltown 27-17.

A dominant first half saw winger Alex Farani scoring two of his three tries to take the Dirty Reds to a 15-7 half-time lead. A second half marred by a high penalty count in favour of Campbelltown and a yellow card to prop David Hankinson meant the home team were constantly on the back foot, but they were still able to score two tries to take the win.

Second grade snapped a two-game losing streak by overcoming Campbelltown 22-15.

Fly-half Matt Pride was instrumental in leading the team around the park with his tactical kicking and by fearlessly attacking the line, despite some tackles aimed above the shoulders.
